

## The Panelists of Peace Forum in Okinawa 2017

### SOKA UNIVERSITY

#### **Hideki Tamai**

He is a Professor of Peace Studies, International Relations at Soka University and Director of Soka University Peace Research Institute (SUPRI). He earned BA (Sociology) at Soka University in 1985 and MA (International Relations) at Soka University in 1989. He started to work at Soka University Peace Research Institute in 1990. He was appointed director of SUPRI and Associate Professor of Faculty of Letters at Soka University in 2008. His study topics are Peace Studies, Peacebuilding and Human Security. He has published articles including ‘The Problems of Human Insecurity in Japan: the case of the US military bases in Okinawa’, ‘Development of Japanese Government Strategy of Peacebuilding in Post-Cold War Era’, ‘Possibilities of the Northeast Asian Community: the view point of Okinawa’, ‘The importance and Difficulties of Reconciliation in the Peacebuilding Process’ and so on.

#### **Hironobu Asaga**

He is a Professor of Environmental Law, Administrative Law at Soka University. He earned BA (Law) at Soka University in 1993, MA (Environmental Sciences) at University of Tsukuba in 1988, and PhD (Real Estate Studies; Environmental Law and Policy) at Meikai University. He worked at Meiji University Law School in 2004-2005, Okinawa University in 2005-2012. He joined Soka University in 2012-present. His study topics are Environmental Law and Policy. He received Academic Award of Research Division of the Japan Society for Impact Assessment in 2010. He belongs to Japan Society for Impact Assessment (Managing Director, Editor-in-Chief), Japan Land Environment Society (Managing Director, Secretary of the research presentation committee), Environmental Law and Policy Association (Editorial Board). He has published numerous articles in academic journals.

#### **Kenji Nakayama**

He is an Associate professor at the Faculty of Law, Soka University. He earned his Ph. D. degree in social science from Waseda University (2014) and is specialized in International Relations. He had served as a staff of Secretariat of the House of Representatives (Shugiin) and a research assistant of Waseda University before joining the Soka University. He has published a book entitled “ *A Study of Endogenous Governance and Transnational Actor in Northeast Asia* ” (Waseda University Press, 2015).

**KYUNGNAM UNIVERSITY****Jung Kim**

He is an Assistant Professor of political science at University of North Korean Studies (UNKS) and director for planning at the Institute for Far Eastern Studies (IFES) of Kyungnam University in Seoul. He is also a lecturer at Graduate School of International Studies and Underwood International College of Yonsei University. Prior to joining UNKS, he worked at East Asia Institute (2009-2013) and IFES (1996-2002) as a senior research fellow and held a visiting research position in Advanced Social and International Studies at University of Tokyo as a Fox International Fellow (2004-2005). He earned his undergraduate degree in political science from Korea University and graduated from Yale University with his doctoral degree in political science. He has published numerous articles in academic journals, including *Asian Perspective*, *Asian Survey*, and *Journal of International and Area Studies* and edited volumes, including *Adapt, Fragment, Transform: Corporate Restructuring and System Reform in South Korea* and *Routledge Handbook of Democratization in East Asia*.

**Dong-Yub Kim**

Assistant Professor, Ph. D.

The Institute for Far Eastern Studies, Kyungnam University

Kim Dong-Yub has received Ph.D. in North Korean Studies (Military & Security) at University of North Korean Studies. He is currently an assistant professor at the Institute for Far Eastern Studies of Kyungnam University and an advisor in The National Unification Advisor council. He lectures at Kyungnam University and Korea Naval Academy. His academic interests are North Korean military, North Korean nuclear issue, northeast Asian security, military negotiation and peace regime.

He had a successful twenty-year career in the ROK Navy before retiring as a commander. He holds a B.A. at the Korea Naval Academy and MA in International Relations at Korea National Defense University. Previously, he had served as a North Korea specialist at the Ministry of National Defence taking part in several military talks between North and South Korea.

**Sung Kyung Kim**

She is an Assistant Professor at University of North Korean Studies, and the director of research at the Institute for Far Eastern Studies, Kyungnam University. She received her Ph.D. from University of Essex (2006) in England, where she was trained in cultural sociology. She worked in Sungkonghoe University and National University of Singapore before joining the University of North Korean Studies. She has published on books and articles in the areas of culture industry focusing on film industry, cultural mobility, and North Korean border crossing. Her current research examines North Korean society in a cultural perspective.

## CHINESE CULTURE UNIVERSITY

### **Chien-kuo Pang**

Chien-kuo Pang earned his Ph. D. degree in Sociology from Brown University of the United States and is specialized in the comparative study of national development. He had served as Associate Professor of National Taiwan University, Taipei City Councilman, Legislator of the Republic of China (Taiwan), and Advisor of the Strait Exchange Foundation. Dr. Pang currently is Professor of the Graduate Institute of National Development and Mainland China Studies at Chinese Culture University.

### **Chien-min Chao**

Dr. Chien-min Chao is a Distinguished Chair Professor at the Graduate Institute for National Development and Mainland China Studies, the Chinese Culture University. Dr. Chao also serves as Dean of the College of Social Sciences at the CCU. Between 2008 and 2012, Dr. Chao was a Deputy Minister for the Mainland Affairs Council at the ROC government. Dr. Chao was a visiting distinguished professor at the George Washington University and visiting teaching professor at the University of Wisconsin-Madison. Dr. Chao has written and edited twelve books, including *Decision-making in China: Leadership, Process and Mechanism* (Taipei, 2014); *Introduction to China and Cross-Strait Relations* (Taipei, 2010); *Lee Teng-hui's Legacy* (M.E. Sharpe, 2002); *Rethinking the Chinese State* (Routledge, 2001); *Analysis to Contemporary Chinese Politics* (Taipei, 1997); *Authoritarian Politics* (Taipei, 1994). Dr. Chao has also produced over 100 articles in academic journals such as the *Asian Affairs*, *Asian Survey*, the *China Quarterly*, *Journal of Contemporary China*, *Pacific Affairs*, *Issues & Studies*, *Chinese Law and Government*, *Zhongguo dalu yanjiu*.

### **Wei-jen Hu**

Wei-jen Hu is the President of the Sino-American Cultural and Economic Association and an Adjunct Chair Professor at Chung Yuan Christian University. As the Standing Supervisor of the Association of Foreign Relations in Taiwan, he holds a Ph.D. from the University of Pretoria, an MS from Georgetown University, and has been a Visiting Scholar at Harvard University twice. A veteran diplomat and government official, Hu has served the Republic of China for about forty years in the fields of foreign affairs and national security. His various posts include Representative (Ambassador) to Germany, Representative to Singapore, Deputy Director General of the National Security Bureau, Deputy Secretary General of the National Security Council, the Secretary General of the National Security Council, and Senior Advisor to the President. Since 2001, Professor Hu has written and assisted in editing ten books mainly covering Sino-American relations and the history of his father, four-star General Hu Tsung-nan. He has authored around twenty articles in recent years. Hu has received the Order of the Bright Star and other medals

from the ROC and foreign governments in recognition of and appreciation for his public service.
